



THEATRE ARTS CAMP 2022

Overnight Programs

Theatre Arts Camp, held in July this year, includes overnight camps for young people in Grades 7–12. Sessions focus on Shakespeare, Musical Theatre, Playwriting and Theatre Production. Taught by professional teaching artists, participants enjoy an intensive schedule of classes, discussion, rehearsal and theatre-going. Each session culminates in a short performance or presentation by the participants for family and friends. The playwriting camp culminates in a reading of the participants' new work by professional actors.

For Grades 7 & 8

- **Shakespeare Focus:** July 3 – 9
- **Musical Theatre Focus:** July 10 – 16

For Grades 9–12

- **Shakespeare Intensive:** July 3 – 16
- **Musical Theatre Intensive:** July 17 – 30

NEW for Grades 8-12

- **Theatre Production Program:** July 17 – 23
- **Playwriting Program:** Hybrid program: virtual sessions Tuesday and Thursday evenings July 5 to 21, followed by overnight week July 24 to 29

DETAILS

Camps take place at the Normal School (270 Water Street) at the Stratford Festival from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day. Each session has one Director and one Assistant Director. Camp Counsellors are hired from university Drama and Education programs to supervise overnight, to and from classes, and during meals and theatre performances.

PERFORMANCE TICKETS

Participants enjoy performances of Shakespeare plays as well as musicals and contemporary pieces in the Stratford Festival's 2022 season. Week-long sessions include three performances; two-week sessions include five.

ACCOMMODATION

Participants will stay at [St. Jerome's University Residence](#) on the University of Waterloo campus in Waterloo and transportation to and from Stratford each day will be by school bus. Students will be divided into cohorts by session with each cohort sharing a secure floor pod. Each pod in this dormitory-style accommodation offers single- and double-room occupancy and common bath. Every room has a small refrigerator, a sink, towels and sheets. Laundry facilities are available.

MEALS

All meals are provided. Each morning, breakfast is served by the St. Jerome's Residence food service. Lunch, dinner and snacks are served onsite at the Normal School. Dietary needs are accommodated.

TRANSPORTATION

During the program, transportation between St. Jerome's University Residence and the Stratford Festival will be provided each day by school bus. Transportation to and from evening theatre performances is also provided by bus. Participants are not permitted to drive their own cars during the course of the program. Transportation to and from Stratford is not included in the cost of the program.

COST: includes all meals, accommodation, daily transportation to and from class, and performances tickets for the duration of the session.

PAYMENT, DEPOSIT AND REFUND POLICIES

A non-refundable \$25 administration fee is due upon registration. A non-refundable \$150 (one-week) or \$250 (two-week) deposit is due 30 days after registration. The balance is due no later than June 1. Tuition, less the deposit, is refundable prior to June 8. No money is refunded after this date. For registrations received after June 1, payment is due in full upon registration.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

Space in the program is limited. Registration is first come, first served. Grade level refers to the participant's grade at the time of registration, before they attend in the summer. Registration details are available online.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What are the benefits of your Theatre Arts Camp?

Our camps are intended to give participants the chance to learn collaboratively and experientially alongside their peers. All of our programs are taught by theatre professionals with teaching experience who create dynamic programming for young people of any age. Participants report that our camps have helped them to increase their self-confidence, further develop their skills as theatre artists and make new friends. In our programming, we aim to provide supportive communities of learning that emphasize having fun and creative playmaking.

Do you have to have theatre experience to participate?

No experience is required. However, the two-week Musical Theatre and Shakespeare Intensives are designed for those with previous theatre experience who are looking for a more rigorous and challenging learning environment.

How old do you have to be to participate?

In July and August, we have a variety of programming:

- Week-long overnight Shakespeare or Musical Theatre camps for young people in Grades 7–8
- Two-week overnight Shakespeare or Musical Theatre camps for young people in Grades 9–12
- **New!** Week-long overnight Theatre Production camp for young people in Grades 8–12
- **New!** Hybrid virtual and overnight Playwriting camp for young people in Grades 8–12

Grade level refers to the participant's grade at the time of registration, before attending in the summer.
