



THEATRE ARTS CAMP

Day Camps 2020

Grades 1 to 6

Our day camps are intended to give participants the chance to learn collaboratively and experientially alongside their peers. Participants report that our camps have helped them to increase their self-confidence, further develop their skills as theatre artists and make new friends. In our programming, we aim to provide supportive communities of learning that emphasize having fun and creative playmaking. The following Day Camp programs are offered for young people in grades 1 – 6:

- **PA Days – January 31, May 1, June 8** (Fall 2020 dates TBA)
- **March Break Camp – March 16 to 20**
- **Summer Day Camp – June 29 to July 3** (no class on July 1)

DETAILS

Camps take place in the Stratford Normal School (270 Water St.) on the corner of Queen and Water in Stratford and run from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. each day. We break for lunch and nutritional snacks. Week-long camps culminate in a short performance by the participants for family and friends. Selected camps include a Festival matinée performance as part of the programming.

PA Day Camps: January 31, May 1, June 8 (9 a.m. - 4 p.m.)

PA Day programs are held in connection with the Avon-Maitland and Huron-Perth school board schedules. With a focus on having fun and building ensemble, participants explore storytelling and character through group games, imaginative exercises, team-building and performance.

Each PA Day has a different focus:

- January 31: Creating a Character Voice
- May 1: Physical Theatre and Movement
- June 8: World of a Play
- The three fall PA Day dates are TBA

March Break Camp: March 16 – 20 (9 a.m. - 4 p.m.)

A chance for students to explore and engage in a variety of skills, from prop-making to projecting your voice. Participants get a chance to create an ensemble rooted in our theme of the season: power. The week culminates in a sharing of work for parents, family and friends.

Summer Day Camps: June 29 to July 3 (9 a.m. - 4 p.m.) Please note: there is no class on July 1

Experience the world of playmaking and play building. Using the themes from *Wendy & Peter Pan*, students will be introduced to specialized drama techniques. The week culminates in a sharing of work for parents, family and friends. This program includes a ticket to the 2 pm matinée of *Wendy & Peter Pan* on June 30th.

INSTRUCTION

All of our programs are taught by theatre professionals with teaching experience who create dynamic programming for students of any age. Each session is led by a minimum of two adults.

MEALS & SNACKS

Students are responsible for their own lunch. Morning and afternoon snacks are provided.
