SUCH STUFF AS DANCE IS MADE ON

I have a coffee mug at home that has outlasted many of my relationships. It's over thirty years old, and the pretty colours it once had have long since faded, but the ballet slippers and their delicate ribbons are still faintly visible. "Dance is the only art wherein we ourselves are the stuff of which it is made" is a lot to fit on one mug, but it has become a talisman for me. As long as I cherish and care for it, the magic will hold. Dance has always been a cornerstone in

my life. It's about to become one in Billy Elliot's life and in the life of his troubled town. Billy has a gift, and it will shine like a diamond in the coal dust just as soon as he can figure out what it is.

We talk of being moved, of moving others and expressing ourselves in movement, but what does it really mean "to dance"? It's said that "you don't choose dance, dance chooses you." It's so hard, so demanding, you would certainly never do it unless you absolutely couldn't not do it. It takes everything you've got and spits vou out without remorse. But if you asked me, as our Billy is asked, how do I feel when I dance, I might just dance in answer. It's hard to explain the joyful pain, the euphoria, the exhilaration. I can say that every day I come to work as a director I'm grateful that I began my career in dance. The rigour and discipline that it demands inform everything I do. Every step tells a story, every gesture carries us forward. Add music, words and song, and there's no limit to the stories you can tell and no more powerful way to tell them.

This magical Festival Theatre space demands that I re-imagine everything about *Billy Elliot the Musical* from the ground up. On the thrust stage, we can't hide. We have to make a virtue of doing everything in full view – so you'll see the rabbit and the hat and how they work together. But I'm confident that, thanks to the extraordinary talents of our designers and remarkable cast, the magic will not only hold, it will transform.



MUSIC AT THE END OF A WORLD

Everybody would agree that *Billy Elliot* is a period piece, but what Donna Feore wants us to recognize is that the period is right now.

Yes, this 2005 musical by Elton John and Lee Hall is based on the 2000 film of the same name, which dramatized events from the infamous 1984–85 British miners' strike, in which 142,000 workers lost over 26,000,000 days of work. In a series of increasingly violent confrontations, five people died, 123 were injured, and 11,291 were arrested.

When it was all over, the British coal industry was decimated. Before the strike, there were 174 working mines. By 2009, there were only six.

"We think we're past all that kind of thing today in 2019," says Feore. "But we're not. Just look around. General Motors closed a plant in Oshawa and put nearly 3,000 people out of work. There are 32,000 teachers in Los Angeles who went out on strike and 800,000 people in America who suffered through the federal government shutdown.

"We're all becoming aware of the sobering reality of what happens when people live from paycheque to paycheque with no real security."

And even more devastating, from Feore's point of view, is what happens to the communities where long-time infrastructures of employment suddenly collapse.

"I think of the softwood lumber industry in northern B.C., where I grew up, the mines in Manitoba, any place where the government suddenly issues statements saying, 'We're going to do this,' without answering what's going to happen to the communities involved.

"The destruction of a community," she

states with finality. "That's what *Billy Elliot* is all about."

But is that necessarily an appropriate topic for a musical?

"It's one of the best," asserts Feore instantly. "When a world is coming to an end, that's the time to examine it. Look at *Fiddler on the Roof* and *The Sound of Music*," she volunteers, mentioning two other shows she has successfully mounted on the Festival stage.

"Why does that work so well? Because the theatre is all about community. We build an instant community with the audience, and when I direct a show on the Festival stage, I treat the audience as my accomplice. We have to work that space to tell the story everywhere and immerse the people in it."

In a situation as broad and sweeping as this one is, it's necessary to have a focal point, and this story has one in its central character: Billy Elliot, the eleven-yearold boy who's the all-seeing eye of this dramatic hurricane.

He's a working-class lad who wants to dance, with a widowed father caught up in the miners' strike, a bullying brother also on strike, and a grandmother whose grip on reality is fading.

"He's only one small boy," admits Feore, "but we see the entire journey of the story through his eyes. He represents hope to us. He heals the community. And it's magical. He is our light, so we have to connect to that child everywhere in that theatre."

By sheer chance, Billy wanders into a ballet class and is instantly thunderstruck by what he sees. Mrs. Wilkinson, the dance teacher, senses at once how Billy is different and what the power of ballet means to him.

"I know what Billy felt," Feore offers with sudden gentleness. "Ballet is my world, too. That's my roots. It's a world that speaks to me. I know the freedom it can give you within very strict boundaries.

"And Billy wants boundaries. He wants to know where he belongs. Billy doesn't know how he does what he does, or even why. He just knows he has to do it, and Mrs. Wilkinson knows she must help him. She sees the light in Billy."

Feore feels that the show's secret weapon is the score by Elton John.

"In any great musical, we sing or dance because it's no longer enough just to speak. And in this show, the singing and dancing come in so many different colours. I don't think there has ever been a more truly contemporary musical than this.

"Elton John understands what it means to be on the outside looking in, whether the barrier is about gender, sexuality, or social class. Like Mrs. Wilkinson, like Billy, or like his best friend. Michael."

Michael is eleven, like Billy, but is already totally comfortable with his queerness.

"Michael simply identifies with being free, with expressing himself," approves Feore. Not with being straight, gay, bi, or trans. And Billy simply doesn't know *not* to love this boy. That is so ahead of its time. And Mrs. Wilkinson gives him the room to understand.

"What is your voice? Who are you? What is your identity? That's the story I'm interested in telling. It's why we do musicals. It's an incredible way to express emotion."

If Mrs. Wilkinson is the show's heroine, its villain is another strong-minded woman, the one who set this whole world in motion: Margaret Thatcher, the prime minister of England at the time of the strike.

"She sent the riot police from London," says Feore, angry as she relates the facts. "The people in the streets were in there fighting not just for their jobs, but for their families, for their lives."

Thatcher's spirit looms large throughout the show, and the second act begins at a



holiday romp where the strikers and their families mock her mercilessly in a song called "Merry Christmas, Maggie Thatcher." It includes the words "We all celebrate today cause it's one day closer to your death."

Interestingly enough, when Thatcher died in 2013, *Billy Elliot the Musical* was still running in London, and the team behind the show let the audience vote as to whether or not that song, with its stinging sentiments, should be performed on the night of her death.

They voted overwhelmingly to leave it in.

LEE HALL

Born in Newcastle upon Tyne, England, in 1966, Lee Hall studied English literature at Cambridge University and went on to work in theatre, TV, radio and film. He has been writer in residence at the Royal Shakespeare Company and at Live Theatre in Newcastle.

Hall received an Academy Award nomination for his screenplay for the 2000 film *Billy Elliot*; his subsequent stage adaptation won the Olivier Award for Best Musical in 2006 and the 2009 Tony Award for Best Book. He also adapted the 1998 film *Shakespeare in Love* into a stage play that had its North American première here at the Stratford Festival in 2016.

Hall's other works for the stage include Cooking With Elvis (1999), nominated for an

Olivier Award for Best Comedy; Spoonface Steinberg (2000), which he adapted from his earlier radio play of the same title; Two's Company (2001); The Pitmen Painters (2007), which won the London Evening Standard Award for Best Play; Our Ladies of Perpetual Succour (2015); and Network (2017). He has also adapted works by such dramatists as Georg Büchner, Bertolt Brecht, Carlo Goldoni and Pierre Reaumarchais

Hall's other screenplays include Steven Spielberg's *War Horse* (2011), *Victoria & Abdul* (2017) and two musical films to be released later this year: *Rocketman*, based on the life of Elton John, and *Cats*, based on the hit stage show.

MUSIC

ELTON JOHN

Born Reginald Kenneth Dwight on March 25, 1947, in Pinner, Middlesex, England, Elton John astonished his family at the age of three by sitting at the piano and playing "The Skater's Waltz" by ear. At age eleven, he was awarded a scholarship to the Royal Academy of Music, which he attended on Saturday mornings for the next four years. He went on to become one of the most acclaimed and successful solo artists of all time, selling more than 300 million records worldwide and giving more than 4,000 performances in more than eighty countries.

An eleven-time Grammy Award nominee, he has won five times (including Best Musical Show Album awards for the Broadway productions of *The Lion King* and *Aida*, the latter of which also won him a Tony Award

for Best Original Score) and received the Grammy Legend Award in 2001. Three of his albums have been inducted into the Grammy Hall of Fame. *Billy Elliot the Musical* was nominated for fifteen Tonys and won ten, including Best Musical.

Knighted in 1998, John has received many other honours, including induction into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and the Rockefeller Foundation Lifetime Achievement Award. In 2002, he was awarded an honorary doctorate by the Royal Academy of Music, and in 2004 he became a Fellow of the British Academy of Songwriters and Composers. This year, he undertakes his final tour, Farewell Yellow Brick Road
